1. If you need to add support and adhesion (base), where can you find it in Cura?

2. How can you tell if the .STL file you downloaded is printable in a 2-hour time frame?

3. What should you do if you need to pause or stop your 3D printing session before the object is completed?

c. Add enough blue tape (from the toolbox) to the print bed. Do not overlap, make sure it is completely flat on the print bed, and make sure you have enough for your 3D object that you wish to print.

- e. Cut the end of the filament to ensure it has a clean nub.
